### "The Unforced Rhythms of Grace"

I tend to get a bit more interested when Jesus shows emotion. Whether it is his rage as he overturns the tables of the moneychangers in the Temple or his tears at the death of his friend Lazarus, an emotional Jesus is an engaging Jesus.

In our Gospel passage this week Jesus starts out pretty angry. Neither John, the baptizing doomsday street preacher nor Jesus, the miracle working, partying hippie seem to shake the Galilean people from their malaise. The kingdom has drawn near and no one will listen or take notice.

Then he abruptly shifts gears and becomes the welcoming, comforting Jesus we all learned about in first-grade Sunday school. Such are the "unforced rhythms of grace." The sermon title comes from a portion of our text as translated in Eugene Peterson's *The Message*

*"Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion? Come to me. Get away with me*

*and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with me and work with me—watch how I do it. Learn the unforced rhythms of grace. I won't lay anything heavy or ill-fitting on you. Keep company with me and you'll learn to live freely and lightly." Matthew 11:28-30.*

If that has a familiar ring to it you will probably recognize it readily from the NRSV.

*"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."*

Our thick-headedness can be frustrating for Jesus but he always shows up with arms outstretched to give us comfort, teach us gentleness and humility, and give us another chance.

Join us Sunday for worship at 10:30 AM as we we explore the unforced rhythms of grace.

**Fellowship Hall /Kitchen Roof** – after inspection we chose an inexpensive “fix” which includedsecuring some shingles and caulking holes. This should stop leaking but simplydelays the inevitable.

**Vestibule WaterFountain** – has been removed and will be replaced by a hot/cold water coolerdispenser gifted by a generous church member.

**Campus Wi-Fi** –existing Wi-Fi did not extend much beyond the offices and choir room. Comtek isworking with us to boost the signal to cover both buildings. This is especiallyimportant to allow the preschool the ability to stream educational material andto replace our sanctuary sound system with an efficient digital one. This initial work is inexpensive and costs are being sharedwith the preschool.
