"Childish Wisdom"

Proverbs 9:1-6 1 Kings 2:10-12; 3:3-14 (Click on Scripture Passage)



We don't usually associate wisdom with youth. In fact, quite the opposite. Wisdom is seen as aged, experienced, patient and discerning. The passage from Proverbs bears that out with the verse "Lay aside immaturity, and live, and walk in the way of insight."

Yet Solomon, the ultimate Biblical "wise man" describes himself as a little child who doesn't know which end is up. Despite his protests God indeed blesses Solomon with wisdom and discernment.

How Solomon uses this new found wisdom is met with both praise and criticism depending on who is making the assessment.

What is wisdom in the context of the modern church? Do our children have a role in our collective wisdom or is it only the currency of our senior citizens? Is it ever more faithful to be foolish instead of wise?
