#### "As For Me And My Household"

Joshua 24:1-2a, 14-18 John 6:56-69 (Click on Scripture Passage)



In our passages from Joshua and John this week the concern is serving God. More specifically, will people take the easy way out, just serve the same local gods as everyone else, or walk away from Jesus and turn from his hard teachings. Or will they commit right then and there to the Lord with a capital "L". The Father with a capital "F".

Joshua famously declares in verse 15 "...but as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." For Joshua it's not just a personal thing, it's a family thing.

The notion of a "family" as just a couple of parents, kids and a dog is a relatively recent understanding. Throughout the long arc of history in all varieties of cultures families, households if you will, were much less narrowly defined. They included multiple generations, cousins, aunts, servants, even working animals. As head of the household, the family, Joshua opts the serve the Lord and that includes everyone.







Bible study will resume on Tuesday September 11th. Scripture passages are Isaiah 50:4-9
