

"Good News From Bad News"

Apparently what happens in Vegas no longer stays in Vegas. We awoke on Monday morning to news of yet another mass shooting, this one the largest in modern history. Las Vegas is now added to the list we have come to hear much too often: Virginia Tech, Columbine, Orlando, Boulder, San Bernadino... the list goes and grows. After a week in the constant news cycle this one feels different to me for a few reasons.

1. Motive. We are as yet unable to assign any sort of logic to it. Usually by now a shooting of this magnitude would be placed in the broad category of terrorist or terrorist leanings, mental illness, bullying, revenge. We don't have that here.
2. The sheer firepower. The arsenal that has been recovered from the shooters hotel room, house and van is incomprehensible. So much so that we might even see at least the beginnings of conversation in Congress on ways to address the most unique of American plagues: daily gun violence.
3. The scene. Many of us have or will attend events where this scene could be repeated.

Festivals, concerts, football and baseball games, etc. Any place with a lot of people and a tall building nearby. Even though the citizens of many nations around the world live in fear in their everyday lives this is new to us.

As chance would have it (or is it?) the Gospel passage for this Sunday is the parable of the wicked tenants which may just be the most violent words to ever come from the mouth of Jesus. Jesus is still duking it out with the temple authorities and weaves a tale of violence and destruction that ultimately lands at their very feet.

Where is God in this? Is there good news here? How about in Las Vegas? Afghanistan? The streets of Chicago? I think we can find good news in the midst of tragedy but it doesn't come easily. Hard questions and a lack of simple answers is the path we must journey.

Join us for worship this Sunday at 10:30 AM where we will ask these questions together and look for a way forward in these increasingly distressing times.


Thank you John for your service to First Presbyterian Church and Godspeed as you answer God's call.


